# **EDF's Organization Profile**



**The Education for Development Foundation (EDF)** was established in 1987 and officially registered with Ministry of Interior as a charitable organization No.4794 in 1991 and was announced by Ministry of Finance in 1994 as a Public Charity No. 255 with tax-exempted status under the laws of Thailand. Every single donation to support any of EDF scholarship programs or development projects can be tax-exempted to the full extent allowed by Thai laws.

*Our goal* is to improve education opportunities and the quality of life for less fortunate children and youths in remote areas of Thailand. Sponsored students receive many opportunities to develop necessary life skills and gain valuable knowledge that can be applied throughout their lives.

*Our ultimate goal* is to encourage these children so that they can free themselves from the cycle of poverty. Education also helps them become quality human resources for the betterment of their own families, rural hometowns and the country as a whole.

EDF's main objectives are:

- 1. To grant scholarships to a variety groups of less fortunate youth and children in Thailand through its scholarship provision in different programs.
- 2. To promote and develop children and youth's self-confidence and career skills so they can be self-reliance and better support their families and communities.
- 3. To promote international understanding, education assistance and culture between countries.
- 4. EDF is a public charity and not involved or engaged in any political issues.

EDF's objective is not to end poverty but to initiate solid programs that promote the development of youth and people, make potential changes and encourage self-reliance through its education support.

#### **Our Programs**

**EDF strongly believes** that education is one of the most important keys in uplifting the quality of life of disadvantaged children and youths, in addition, to prevent many social problems. Those with basic education can utilize and apply their knowledge to gain entry to skilled worker job opportunities or to higher education. This liberates them from poverty and prevents them from falling victim to low-paying, menial jobs or human trafficking.

In order to accomplish the aforementioned goals, EDF has continuously provided scholarships and implemented various development projects since 1987. These efforts have ensured that impoverished rural children complete at least a basic education and enjoy enriched learning opportunities as well as improved prospects for a better quality of life.

With solid cooperation and active support from both public and private sectors in all areas we operates, the EDF Scholarship Program has benefited more than 300,000 children from over 4,000 rural Thai schools to date.

# EDF's five main undertakings include:


1. Lower Secondary Scholarship Program for students from impoverished family backgrounds who desires to further study in higher level.

2. Upper Secondary/Vocational Scholarship Program for students with good academic performance from impoverished families.

3. Scholarship Program for Children with Disabilities, in inclusive education settings.

4. "Under the Same Sky" Scholarships Program for orphaned students in the 3 violence-affected southernmost provinces of Thailand.

5. Learning & Life Improvement Projects for students and schools in remote rural areas. These projects include, for example, agriculture knowledge and career skills improvement, ICT education development, library, school bank, health promotion and youth educational camp.
