Executive Summary

Remarkable year 4, Education Technology Support (ETS) project continues to provide computer equipments, internet, training, scholarships and bicycles with aims to improve knowledge and skill related to computer for 16 needy schools in 3 provinces of the Northeast: Sakon Nakhon, Mukdaharn and Nakhon Panom. Apart from providing basic computer equipments, this year ETS also emphasizes on advantages of having animators at each school to motivate the students and work closely with EDF. Moreover 'ETS Coordinators' were introduced to supervise the animators and the school as well as involve in monitoring.

In 2010, additional 8 schools located in the 3 provinces were selected to join ETS Year 4. They were equipped with appropriate 70 computer sets and internet connection. 123 students from those schools and elsewhere receive 3 - year scholarships. 105 bicycles were also distributed to needy students having difficulty to commute to schools. Nevertheless, the existing schools were equipped with UPS, webcam and headset to use in the program's activities, since they were not provided in the early years. The schools started to use received computers immediately and classes were planned to match with other classes and the animators' timetable. In addition, training sessions were held at Sakon Nakhon Education Service Area Office 1 during July 28th to August 2nd for 4 student leaders, 1 teacher and 1 animator (6 attendees per school) from each school. The schools were divided into 3 groups and attended 2-day training by taking turns to come to the sessions. The topics were taught on basic computer, maintenance, troubleshooting, internet, e-mail, and social network. Not only the school personnels, but also ETS Coordinators and provincial committeemen were invited to be part of the sessions by supervising the participants. They were able to collaborate with the schools and EDF. After the training, everyone

had personal e-mail and Facebook account, so that they can contact with one another. In the first few months after the training, EDF log on MSN to supervise the students, the animators and the teachers to be familiar with internet communication, while they were able to add more friends from other project schools.

A Sharing-Learning Seminar was organized during October inviting 1 school director, 1 teacher and 1 animator from each school by utilizing 'Knowledge Management' method to conduct the seminar. This was to update and share information of the project, on-going activities and most importantly brainstorming for new upcoming activities. EDF realizes the significance of participation; we open an opportunity to every school to be part of project planning and implementation. From the seminar, we could come up with many ideas of improvement and activities.

This year, the beneficiaries have been increased as well as activities. The gap between urban children and rural children have become narrower. They have been receiving better accessibility to computer and have opportunities to expand and share their knowledge through the use of computer and internet.



Program Objectives

Increase Accessibility to Computers

ETS Year 4's number of provided computer were increased noticeably giving more schools to access to more computers with appropriate computer ratio (1 computer/2 students). The project provides a total of 70 computer sets, 123 scholarships and 105 bicycles to 8 needy schools in 2010.

Maintain Sustainability and Program Activeness

Not only equipping the schools with proper computer is important, but also keeping the project run and interesting for children will make it sustainable. Actively participating the project's activities is to be encouraged by introducing up-to-date programs and websites, such as instant messaging, Facebook and Google.

'ETS Coordinators' were also introduced to assist and supervise the existing animators, working closely with the provincial committees and providing more detailed information to EDF of student performance, problems and progress.

Active training and Remote Supervision

ETS 2010's trainings were organized at Sakon Nakhon Education Service Area Office 1 aiming to effectively train student leaders, animators and teachers of basic computer skill and up-to-date programs. As we are trying to solve problems the

schools facing, the trainings were also to teach basic maintenance, so that they can perform easy maintenance at school by themselves instead of bringing computers to a shop. Also, constant remote monitoring by chatting through MSN and Facebook with the school personnels can supervise and motivate them to use internet communication, so as to increase internet skill and strengthen networking between the project schools.

Provide education opportunity

ETS continues to provide education support to the project schools and other rural schools in the Northeast along with bicycles for students to commute to schools. Needy M. 1 students receive 3-year scholarships throughout M.3. Separately, students whose houses are located far away from school were selected to receive bicycles.

Computer Training

ETS Training was held at Sakon Nakhon Education Service Area Office 1 during July 28th to August 2nd for all the 16 project schools. The participants are not only students, but also teachers and animators. The purposes were to train student leaders, so that they can go back to school and teach other students. The animators and the teachers were also expected to learn and supervise the students. The main topics were: computer hardware assembly, OS troubleshooting, drivers, installing anti-virus applications and how to handle infected files. Moreover, the training included internet-related topics: how to search for contents in the web, e-mail, Windows Messenger and how to share contents or files on Facebook.

4 student representatives, 1 teacher and 1 animator from each school were selected to attend the training by taking turns coming to the sessions. They also were able to learn as a team motivating the teachers and the animators to learn together with the children. Each school would attend 2-day training. EDF used both academic methodology and entertaining to conduct the session making it more interesting and fun to learn.

After the training, everyone would have their own e-mails and Facebooks. They were able to add their new friends' addresses. Afterward, they would use computer and internet at school to contact with their friends and EDF. Also, the trained students would help teachers to train other students.

The training was well organized and received good feedback from the participants. It is, thus, important to provide basic knowledge and good training, so that they can maintain computer and use it properly.

Day Two

Sharing-Learning Seminar

Sharing-Learning Seminar was held at Sakon Nakhon Education Service Area Office 1, Sakon Nakhon Province (Oct 15th, 2010). ETS school directors and teachers were invited to share their experiences, problems, solution and other suggestions.

Objectives

- To help related parties realize the importance of effective and sustainable development for ETS
- To identify needed improvements for longterm development, laying foundations for following phases of the program
- To create a program framework which will lead the success of new activities for later implementation
- To discuss the criteria for the selection of “ETS Super School;” a model school which excels in the implementation and development of the program
- To discuss the possibilities of second quarter activities and decide a date for online conference to report ETS progress

- Plans for ETS Contest

- Video conference and online exchange between program schools on various topics
- The sufficient number of computers for students as well as a fast, reliable internet connection
- Students should be able to communicate with friends from different schools or in other countries
- The cooperation of all relevant organizations assist students in IT learning

Current Developments

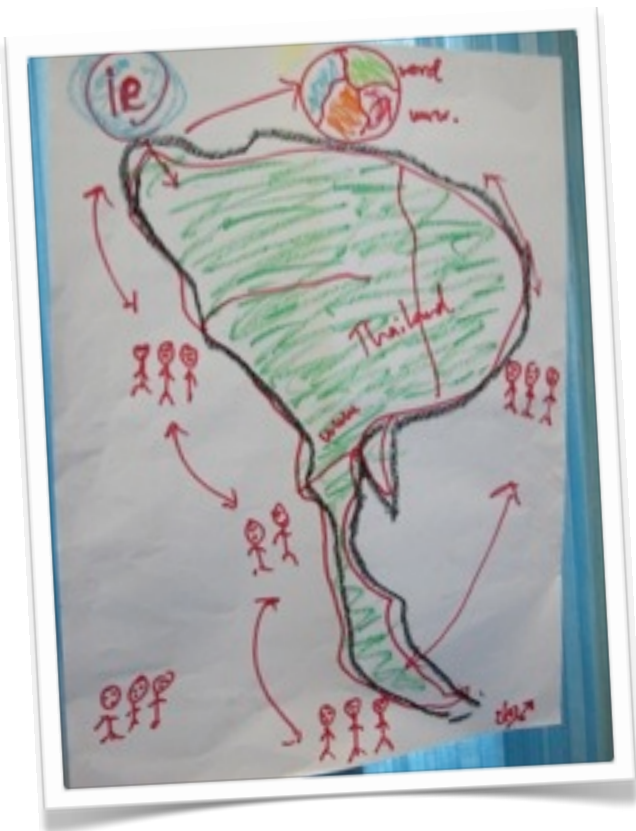
Nakhon Panom Province Schools

- Students from pre-school to P.6 now have access to computers due to the sufficient number of machines. Originally, this was not so
- Target grade level students (P.3-P.6) now all have email addresses which they use to communicate with friends and their school animators
- Students are now able to troubleshoot more computer problems such as crashes and memory dumps
- Teachers have all registered for their own email accounts and have become more familiar with the web
- School management realizes the importance of IT education

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- The community now sees the importance of computers. They were originally against it
- Community members have access to school computers and can use various IT services such as composing and printing invitations, etc.
- A stronger community bond is established. The majority of IT volunteers are former students of the schools. Although the wage is limited, they are willing to assist in any capacity.





Sharing-Learning Seminar

Mukdaharn Province Schools

- Each school is now installed with high speed internet connections. Each now also have websites.
- Schools now provide IT assistance to community members.
- Schools have created their own teaching materials including websites, e-books and posters. Moreover, students are taught how to create these media as well.
- Each student now has his/her own email accounts.
- Volunteers have introduced social networking to students. These sites include :Facebook, Hi!5, MSN.

Sakon Nakhon Province Schools

- Students learned how to efficiently use the internet, registered for their own email accounts and have familiarized themselves with social networking.
- Schools inform the communities about their work in IT and have offered to become the center for IT service and learning.
- Former students volunteered to become IT assistants, strengthening the community bond between generations.

Activities for 2nd Quarter

Participants have submitted the following ideas for 2nd quarter activities:

- Penpals (Email) between schools.

- Hold chat events every Tuesday and Thursday ('MSN Day') from 1:00pm - 4:00pm where students can logon to their messenger accounts and chat with their friends. EDF staff will also be present online to monitor and chat along.
- Create electronic greeting cards to send to friends.

Monitoring

Animators

Computer animators are seen to play important role in driving the program and motivating students as well as teachers to use internet as a tool to search more information and communicate with one another. However, from our monitoring and the schools' evaluation, a result showed that assigned animators cannot come to teach at the schools as often as they requested. This makes it difficult for the schools to match class timetable with the animators'. So, the teaching was not conducted persistently to all the students. Moreover, some animators have decided not to continue to another year. The reasons are that they have to give priority to their main job and



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some have to earn more money to support their families. Since animators receive very little pay, most animators loose interest in working with the program as they cannot contribute the time. They thus do not intend to stay long enough to continue the program which makes the teaching as well as communication with EDF unstable.

Teachers

Teachers are asked to work with animators to adjust class' timetable and create curricula to use with the ETS program. They are also asked to provide EDF with regular updates, student information and feedback. They are the closest ones with the students, whom we see the most valuable source for program feedback from school. Nevertheless, they still lack of skill; they usually teach only Microsoft Office.

Students

Students are the most active participants in the program. They learn very fast and eager to learn more. Computer is from time to time not sufficient for the students when they are out of order. They seem to expand their networking to friends from different schools. Moreover, the student leaders help the animators and the teachers during computer class to supervise other students. However, it is still difficult for most of them to do maintenance and solve problems, such as virus and hardware problem.

ETS Coordinators

After the introduction of ETS coordinators, they went to visit the schools and sent EDF feedback with photographs and updates of new emerging problems. The coordinators were assigned to take one time visit per month to gain regular updates. However, they were unable to do it as often as we requested and it is difficult to control.

Remote Monitoring

EDF staff logged on to the Windows Live Messenger account and Facebook for the first few months to motivate internet using between the project schools. The students were welcome to chat, post comments, ask questions and share information. And, the schools are also asked to give progress report by e-mail..



SWOT Analysis

STRENGTHS

- Having animators who can teach up-to-date programs and understand the students of their nature
- School principals and teachers have been working with EDF for a long time, so it is better in communication and cooperation
- Schools are equipped with good computers and equipments
- Schools form a network, so as to exchange ideas through e-mails



WEAKNESSES

- Animator's schedule is unstable and difficult to match with school's
- Animators tend to stop assisting the schools after a period of time to seek full-time job
- Some schools still have insufficient speed of internet, because they are located in very rural area
- Lack of skill to maintain computer
- ETS Coordinators are so busy that they could not keep up with the schools as plan



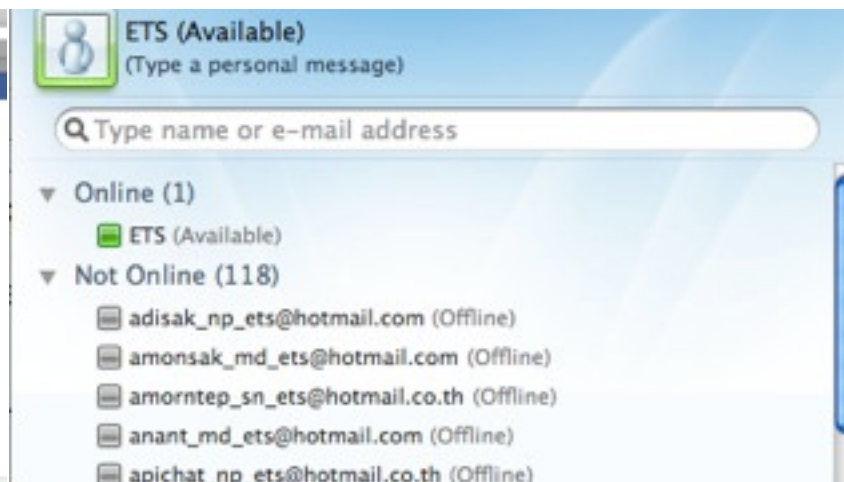
OPPORTUNITIES

- Students search for more knowledge from internet and develop themselves
- Animators can become contract teachers for teaching computer by sharing salary with school
- Expand to more project schools
- Organize a contest amongst project schools and have community participated



THREATS

- Computer problems and lack of maintenance
- Teachers have so many works that sometimes lost contact with EDF
- Small schools have insufficient fund for computer maintenance



Suggestions & Future Plans

The animators should be taking more role and responsibilities. We believe that having well trained animators will stabilize their teaching and convey their knowledge to many more students. Training for the animators together with in charge teachers should be organized. Its purposes are;

- to have the same understanding of how to run the project and its main purposes;
- to train the animators and the teachers so they can provide effective and appropriate training to more students;
- and to motivate the animators and the teachers to take more responsibility and work together as a team, so that they stay with the schools in a long term period

In stead of training only representatives from each school of basic computer and programs as previously organized, this training session for the animators and the teachers will focus also on how to teach and convey right messages to the students which will affect more beneficiaries. Their role will be engaged in more administrative, management and developing activities. After the training session, each school will be encouraged to organize their own trainings to their students. This will also raise awareness of sense of belonging.

Moreover, sufficient funds should be allocated to hire animators as contracted, long-term personnel. The project schools can also hire the animators as contracted teachers to teach computer at the project schools by sharing wages with ETS. This will provide sufficient income for the animators allowing them to remain with the program and provide sustainability to their curriculum.

In addition, ETS Contest should be organized to motivate and strengthen the project schools to interact and share their knowledge to one another. Also, this will give recognition to winners, so that they are proud of themselves and help their friends to learn computer. The contest's activities can be promoting their own community, their unique culture or the schools' projects through making of video clip. The video clip can be placed in an internet site and spread to wider beneficiaries. By this, the community will also have opportunity to participate in the project and be proud of their children.

Also, as EDF had organized a Sharing-Learning Seminar in October 2010, one should be included in 2011's plan as a monitoring method to improve the project. Moreover, a remote monitoring by MSN and Facebook will be conducted to monitor internet usage of students.

In 2011, a minimum of 4 new schools in the 3 provinces are currently underway to include additional school to the project. At present, 4 schools have already been selected from Mukdaharn Province and Nakhon Panom Province. ETS will maintain network between project schools by implementing more activities and encouraging them to participate in thinking process which will benefit even more students and communities.
