Executive Summary




“In FY 2022, the improvement in the COVID-19 pandemic situation in Thailand relaxed some control measures by the government, which enhanced EDF’s resource mobilization capabilities and the carrying out of its ongoing activities and also enabled us to raise 8,060 scholarships funds for underprivileged students in the academic year 2022.”

In fiscal year 2022 (April 1, 2022 – March 31, 2023), EDF’s total revenue amounted to 76,606,516.75 baht, a 5.48% increase compared to the same period for FY 2021. Domestic revenue accounted for 45,531,832.51 baht, a 2.71% increase from FY 2021 and international revenue accounted for 31,074,684.24 baht, a 2.77% increase from FY 2021.

EDF’s major sponsors in FY 2022 included Mubadala Energy (Thailand), 3.76 million baht; Bank of America (Continuing project FY 2021–2022), 2.27 million baht; The Regional English Language Office (RELO) of US Embassy Thailand, 2.07 million baht; Chiang Mai University Engineering Alumni Association, 1.32 million baht; UBS Securities (Thailand) Ltd., 1.64 million baht; Knorr-Bremse Global Care Asia Pacific Ltd., 1.55 million baht and American Women’s Club of Thailand, 1.2 million baht.


For academic year 2022, EDF provided 8,060 scholarships worth 19,070,700 baht to needy students in 1,172 schools and universities throughout Thailand.



In 2022, EDF Foundation received its second consecutive CAF International’s “CAF Validated Organization Certificate” for meeting CAF International’s extensive review of guards against the risk of fraud, money laundering or other illicit activities.

Throughout its 35 years of scholarships operation in Thailand (1988–2022), EDF had granted a total of 406,560 scholarships worth 715,908,849 baht to underprivileged and needy students in 5,728 educational institutions in Thailand.

Furthermore, EDF has expanded scholarship support and a variety of developmental projects to the Greater Mekong Sub region (GMS) countries. In FY 2022, EDF granted 6,693 scholarships to poor students and schools in the GMS countries including development project funding for Laos and Cambodia amounting to 24,430,827.44 baht.

The Education for Development Foundation (EDF)

Resource Mobilization Achievement Fiscal Year 2022

In FY 2022, EDF had an annual revenue of 76,606,516.75 baht, an increase of 5.48% from FY 2021. Scholarship revenue increased by 2.32% to 40,548,602.41 baht. Development project revenue increased by 11.15% to 34,579,278.52 baht and revenue from other sources amounted 1,478,635.82 baht. Domestic revenue accounted for 45,531,832.51 baht or 59.44 % of total annual revenue in FY 2022.

FY 2022, featured special events and activities included:

▼ **The American Women’s Club of Thailand (AWC)’s** 11th year donation worth 1,206,000 baht, which was raised among their members to support educational scholarships of 201 needy female high school students under EDF administration.

▼ **MUJI Retail (Thailand) Co., Ltd.** provided 50 scholarships worth 292,924.50 baht to less fortunate Thai students, which was raised from its donation boxes at MUJI outlets located in shopping malls. From 2015-2022, the company supported EDF Foundation with a total of 2,921,505.25 baht benefitting 521 less fortunate Thai students’ education. The company also exhibited their products and promoted EDF scholarship program at its stores to generate public interest.

▼ **The "Save Dropout Students, Help Them to Graduate"** crowd funding campaign promoted through taejai.com raised 414,904 baht scholarship funds for 151 underprivileged lower secondary students (Grade 8 or Grade 9) and prevented them from dropping out of school in the academic year 2022.

▼ **‘Small school’s canteen improvement’** crowd funding campaign promoted through www.edfthai.org to help purchase needed canteen equipment for schools raised 282,342 baht and granted to seven primary schools in 2022.

▼ **“New Kicks for the Kids”** crowd funding campaign promoted through taejai.com, aimed at providing 1,000 new pairs of shoes to rural area students, and successfully raised 462,000 baht.

▼ **JCB Thailand jointly promoted “New Kicks for the Kids”** to help raise campaign awareness via JCB Thailand Facebook fan page with approximately 84,000 followers.

▼ **EDF opened an online store on the Shopee platform** to expand donor base and provide donors convenient means to purchase various charity products and donation coupons to support EDF scholarship program. Issued donation receipts can be used for tax deduction purposes.

▼ **Thai singer “Bank” Sornram Namphet** donated his full prize winnings of 50,000 baht from “Duet Show Together” broadcasted on Channel One31 to support 25 lower secondary scholarships.

▼ **"DJ Dada" Varinda Damrongphon** promoted the EDF scholarship program on “Masterchef Celebrity Thailand Season 3” aired on TV Channel 7 HD. Heliconia H Group Co., Ltd. produced it.

▼ **PricewaterhouseCoopers Consulting (Thailand) Ltd.** handed a donation of 27,000 baht, raised via CSR activities from the company’s employees, to help support the education of less fortunate Thai students under EDF scholarship program in academic year 2022.

▼ **Percepta Services (Thailand) Co., Ltd.** organized “Per Mission Charity Night 2022” and raised 38,144 baht among the company’s working personnel, which provided 19 lower secondary scholarships in the 2022 academic year.

- ▼ Rabbit Rewards organized a campaign to turn points into merits by allowing their members to change 'Rabbit Points' into donations to support EDF scholarship program. A total of 14,000 baht was raised to support lower secondary students in the academic year 2022.
- ▼ Fukuoka Kenjin Kai conducted an EDF leaflets distribution activity among its 100 Japanese members to promote EDF scholarship program.
- ▼ Mr. Tadashi Hasegawa visited and met with EDF in connection to its establishment of the "HASEGAWA Ryo Fund" to help provide educational scholarships to 231 less fortunate Thai students for seven consecutive years covering academic year 2022-2028.
- ▼ Chiang Mai University Engineering Alumni Foundation (CMUEAF) donated 1,009,000 baht to support "Road to modern Kids with the modernized IT" project for the academic year 2022-2023.
- ▼ Chiang Mai University Engineering Alumni Foundation (CMUEAF) donated 200,000 baht to support the scholarships of 40 disabled students under the EDF program for the academic year 2023.

- ▼ Coach Tum (Mr. Amnart Limcharoen), founder & director of School of Wealth and S.O.W Co., Ltd. presented 22,000 baht raised from the organization's activities to provide 11 scholarships to needy lower secondary students for academic year 2023.
- ▼ WEB SPLASH Co., Ltd. donated 10,000 baht to support five lower secondary scholarships in the academic year 2023.
- ▼ TCC Technology Co., Ltd. organized the "Turn Gift to Give" activity that raised 200,000 baht among their clients and partners to help support the scholarships of 40 upper secondary school underprivileged students under the EDF Foundation in the academic year 2023.
- ▼ Dr. Sun Thathong organized a "Charity Classical Music Concert", which raised 60,000 baht to support 30 lower secondary students under EDF program in the academic year 2023.

Chart 1: Comparison of total revenue between Fiscal Year 2021 and 2022




Chart 2: Number of Scholarships categorized by educational level of beneficiaries, Academic Year 2022




Chart 3: Number of scholarships categorized by scholarship program, Academic Year 2022




Chart 4: Source of Scholarship Revenue, Academic Year 2022






Chart 5: Project Funding Support categorized by type of project and number of beneficiaries, Fiscal Year 2022

Education Development in Thailand Fiscal Year 2022

Scholarship Project

In 2022, EDF continued to support scholarships to underprivileged students. Funds were provided by individual donors, groups of people and organizations who understand the importance of education and care about society, especially the needy children and youth. The major donors included:

▼ **Mubadala Energy (Thailand) Co., Ltd.** Supported scholarships to children of fishermen's families and students whose families suffered from COVID-19 pandemic in the provinces of Prachuab Khiri Khan and Songkhla. In addition, in 2022, the funding for the project carried forward from 2021 was allocated as scholarships to 50 students each affected by COVID-19 in Prachuab Khiri Khan and Songkhla provinces.

▼ **American Women's Club of Thailand (AWC).** Supported high school scholarships for female students by promoting access to educational opportunities for young women. In addition, AWC volunteers visited school and scholarship students under their sponsorship and conducted English teaching activities, including organizing a drawing contest to enhance the experience of students under the program.

▼ **Knorr-Bremser Global Care Asia Pacific Ltd.** Supported scholarships to lower secondary and vocational levels in Chachoengsao province for the 2nd year in the 2022 academic year. The company, under EDF coordination, also extended educational assistance to scholarship students with the donation of 10 sets of computer notebooks plus necessary equipment to further help support their educational and IT skills.

To coordinate and communicate with teachers, scholar students and network schools nationwide, EDF mainly used Line application as a prime communication channel to consult and give them advice about the betterment of workflow process. The foundation also set up a Line Group to communicate with senior high-school scholars,

as well as provided advice relating to scholarships and life skills preparation prior to their graduation. Additionally, EDF provided university level scholarships to four students who completed their senior high school during the 2022 academic year.

Support for undergraduate scholars is a continuous scholarship given to existing scholarship students who have graduated high school. In the academic year 2022, there were 19 students who graduated from high school and were eligible to receive scholarships to study at a bachelor's degree level and there were four scholarship students who had been supported until they graduate with bachelor's degree.

During academic year 2022, EDF allocated 8,060 scholarships to underprivileged students in 48 provinces across Thailand with total scholarships worth 19,070,700 baht. From 1988 to the current academic year, EDF had provided a total of 406,560 scholarships worth 715,908,849 baht to underprivileged students around Thailand.

Children, School, and Community Development Projects

EDF has been implementing educational development projects in targeted needy schools, along with activities to improve the quality of life of community members and lower educational, as well as reduce social inequalities and gaps. EDF projects are aimed at promoting educational opportunities under the "School Based Development Model" strategy. The strategy helps promote 22nd century skills and project-based learning both within and outside the classrooms, such as project based activities and learning integrated with existing eight major subjects and more.



EDF's development projects also included improving school environment, facilities, basic infrastructure and supporting educational equipment and tools for students' learning. The project includes community development aimed at promoting community members' career, income generation skills and sustainability.

In addition, the project has been expanded to develop and promote vocational skills for youth in vocational and higher education levels to help them in their career after graduation, as well as to cultivate awareness of being a responsible citizen in society (Active Citizen).

All EDF projects put emphasis on the participation of all concerned parties, sustainable development (educating youth about natural resources conservation) and capacity building.

In FY 2022, EDF received continuous support from the Charities Aid Foundation of America or CAF America, which is the central organization that supports funds for development projects by non-profit organizations around the world. CAF America has certified EDF since 2020 for its financial transparency and projects' management efficiency.

Health Promotion Projects

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, more and more donors and supporters realized the importance of students' health promotion. EDF received support from several renowned organizations including:

▼ **Plan International Thailand and AstraZeneca**, in collaboration with EDF, has continued promoting health under the 'Young Health Programme' project for the 2nd year. The project promoted awareness of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) among teachers, primary school students and university students. The program covered 32 schools and universities, including schools in Bangkok, Samut Prakan, Pathum Thani and Nonthaburi provinces.

Education Development and Learners' Capability Building Project

The project was aimed at developing learning environments, both within and outside the classrooms, promoting students' income and learning effectiveness, as well as preparing students for life skills and vocational skills for the betterment of their future.

In FY 2022, EDF continued to expand its education development and learners' capability-building projects at all levels comprising primary, secondary, vocational and university. The project benefited 72,803 primary school students, university students and educational professionals.

Organizations included:

▼ **Mubadala Energy (Thailand) Ltd.**, under **Mubadala Petroleum Integrated Development Project (MPID)**, has been supporting students, schools and communities in Songkhla province for 10 years and Prachuab Khiri Khan province for 7 years. The project makes use of child-centered strategy approach to encourage actual learning and practice.

▼ **Skilling up Youths for Community Development Program** for students in vocational colleges is funded by **Citi Foundation** through vocational skills training in various fields, including accounting, E-Marketing and other fields that are important in running a business. Participating students can apply the knowledge gained in their communities or pass on the knowledge to the communities in the form of training programs.

▼ **Career and Environmental Development Program** funded by **Bank of America Corporation** is a career educational program for students to help participating students generate some income from their own small businesses. The program also puts emphasis on environmental related development.

▼ **ICT Service for All project** and volunteering activity, funded by **HP Foundation and HP Inc. (Thailand) Ltd.**, is a project to provide computer equipment to develop IT skills in school and in the community. The Foundation organized Digital Literacy training for students at schools in Pathum Thani and Nakhon Pathom provinces **benefiting 932 students and teachers.**

Volunteer activities by **HP Foundation and HP Inc. (Thailand) Co., Ltd.** were aimed at promoting IT skills to participating schools' students and introducing them to modern IT products.

In addition, volunteers joined tree planting at agricultural demonstration center to benefit schools and surrounding communities. Furthermore, participating schools provided opportunities to people in the community to use HP IT facilities.

Chiang Mai University Engineering Alumni Association's **"Road to the Modern Kids with the Modernized IT"** project. The project was aimed at providing computer sets and related IT equipment to five needy schools in Prachinburi, Saraburi, Chachoengsao, Nakhon Ratchasima and Sa Kaeo provinces. The project also covered maintenance

workshop, IT skills trainings and digital literacy training and computer room renovation at each school. The project reached 730 teachers and students.

▼ In addition, EDF Foundation was entrusted by the **Regional English Language Office (RELO), the US Embassy of Thailand**, to coordinate with teachers and education personnel involved in English teaching from 9 different countries in Asia and others, Some 30 people attended the English language skills development training on 28 November - 1 December 2022 at Courtyard by Marriott Bangkok Hotel.

Income-Generating and Career Development Project

The project was aimed at promoting a variety of skill sets, such as agriculture, occupational skills for students in primary schools and extended primary schools. The project created additional income for schools and students from the sale of products both online and offline. Students were also able to practice skills related to cooking, food processing, drinks preparation, basketry, handi-

craft, sewing, massage, fertilizer production, agriculture production, etc. In FY 2022, **Target Foundation** from the US was the major donor organizing life skills training for students at **four targeted schools in Ratchaburi province, benefiting a total of 250 people.**

Agricultural Projects

The project targeted students, schools and communities encouraging participation from communities, partners and others. The project helped develop teacher leaders and student leaders through different trainings, such as organic farming, school exchange sessions, nutrition education, project management, classroom integration, setting up organic farming youth clubs and leadership training. The program's organic farming knowledge and benefits were extended to student families and their communities. The project helped prepare a school food education curriculum, supplied vegetables to school lunch program and for selling to communities. The project also helped in the spin of community agricultural demonstration centers in participating areas. **UBS Securities (Thailand) Co., Ltd.** was the major donor for this project.





Remarkable Projects Fiscal Year 2022

Organic Agriculture for Lunch Project and Generating Income from Agricultural Product Processing

UBS Securities (Thailand) Co., Ltd. was the major supporter that has funded the project for 17 years in a row. In FY 2022, the project benefited seven schools in six provinces, including Nong Khai, Beung Kan, Loei, Nakhon Phanom, Mahasarakham and Kanchanaburi provinces. The project was aimed at school organic gardening for school lunch program. It has helped reduce school ex-

penses and increase income from selling processed agricultural products to communities and others. Other activities included students' online marketing and environment-friendly packaging design. The project benefited 4,665 people.

Youth Capacity Improvement and IT Skill Development Project

HP Foundation and HP Inc. (Thailand) Co., Ltd. provided 15 IT equipment and computer sets, along with a

computer room renovation budget under the "ICT Service for All" project implemented at Bang Luang Wittayakom School and Wat Preedaram School in Nakhon Pathom province and Suntharo Metta Prachasan School in Pathum-Thani province benefiting a combined total of 932 students and teachers.

TP Global Marketing Services (TPGMS) provided 12 sets of computers and IT equipment to Wat Thotsathit School in Pathum Thani province and provided a budget to renovate its computer room. It also organized IT trainings to students and teachers aimed at enhancing IT capabilities for further future career development.

Siemens Energy Co., Ltd. provided five sets of computers and IT equipment to Nopparattanaram School in Pathum Thani province to develop IT skills of students and teachers.

Integrated Development Project

Mubadala Energy (Thailand) Ltd. funded the "Integrated Development" project for children, schools, and communities in Songkhla province for ten years and Prachuab Khiri Khan province for seven years. The project aimed to promote the education of youths by improving their quality of life and making them valuable community members. The company also provided scholarships to fishermen's children, helped the community to be self-reliant and conducted project-based learning in the community. The project provided occupational training to villagers in communities through "Love Home, Love Sea" camp, "My Home" camp and "Leisure Time and Learning" camp for teachers and students.

The company also approved budgetary savings in year 2021 for use as scholarships for 50 students affected by the COVID-19 virus in Songkhla province and another 50 students in Prachuab Kiri Khan province and for the construction of "Busarakam Library" at Don Takian School in Prachuab Khiri Khan province. The library is open for use by students, teachers, parents and people in the community. In 2022, The "Integrated Development" project benefited 25,412 people in Songkhla and Prachuab Khiri Khan provinces.

Occupational skills development support project and community development

Funded by Citi Foundation, "Skilling up Youths for Community Development Program" was aimed at providing knowledge and occupational skills such as accounting, E-Marketing, products packaging designs, etc that are important for business operation. Fifteen vocational colleges in Nonthaburi, Samutprakarn and Nakhon Pathom provinces participated. The training workshop provided students hands-on experience in projects implemented in communities near their educational institutions, which also helped improve relationships between educational institutions, homes and communities.

The project provided direct benefits to 150 students and another 2,018 indirect students beneficiaries, 259 teachers and 1,974 community members. Altogether, the project had a total of 19,612 beneficiaries.





Occupational skill development and environmental development project

Bank of America Corporation funded “Career and Environmental Development” project aimed at helping students from 12 schools in Kanchanaburi and Ratchaburi provinces acquire income generating occupational skills. In addition, schools participating in the project generated some revenue, including environment-related projects. The project included training in online marketing (digital marketing training), product processing and environment-friendly packaging.

Sixty Bank of America Corporation volunteers visited and participated in school activities with students and teachers. The project benefitted 120 core students, 1,320 participating students and 60 teachers and through this project, the school can be integrated into an optional curriculum.

Health Promotion Projects

The project was funded by Plan International and Astra-Zeneca, while EDF acted as project coordinator. The project targeted primary school and university students in the age-range of 10-24 years old and aimed at promoting health awareness and lowering risks from non-communicable diseases (NCDs), as well as other health issues caused by smoking, drinking, having no exercise, low nutrition food consumption and air pollution. These have been among the major cause of deaths in many countries. The project was implemented in 32 schools, colleges and universities in Bangkok and Samut Prakan provinces. Its major activities included training teacher leaders and student leaders in organizing health promotion activities in the universities. The project was able to develop 215 teacher leaders and student leaders.
